
**2022 Test Scores for PSSA\* and Keystone\*\***








"Even though they aren't your real parents and could never replace them, houseparents are here to teach you everything you need to be successful in this world. They are here because they care."





### **Athletics**

All champions start somewhere, and athletics are a vital part of the Milton Hershey School experience. MHS has a long tradition of developing student athletes who succeed in the classroom and in competition.

Participation in sports builds character, confidence, discipline, time management, and teamwork—all qualities that point to future success. With more than 600 students participating annually in either competitive or intramural/club athletics, our athletes take advantage of our experienced coaches and world-class facilities while learning to compete with courage, resilience, loyalty, and determination.

MHS offers 19 sports with varsity, JV, and some freshman teams. Our program has produced many championship seasons ending with district and state titles. Spartan athletic teams compete against public and private schools in the Mid-Penn Conference.

By living where they play, MHS athletes have greater access to coaches, training facilities, practices, strength and conditioning workouts, team and skill camps, tournaments, and off-season opportunities.

## **History**

**JUST THE FACTS** 

Founded in 1909 by chocolate industrialist Milton S. Hershey and his wife Catherine, Milton Hershey School offers children pre-K through 12th grade a top-tier education with all costs covered through the Hersheys' trust.

### Location

MHS is located in beautiful Hershey, Pennsylvania, 25 minutes from Harrisburg, 90 minutes from Baltimore, and just under two hours from Philadelphia.



# Campus

At more than 7,000 acres, the MHS campus is one of the largest in the United States. With more than 200 buildings, 6 swimming pools, animal barns, a 7,000-seat stadium, and 1:1 technology, it is one of the most well-resourced, technologically advanced, and well-maintained educational institutions in the world.

### **Enrollment**

### Approximately 2,000 students, Pre-K-Grade 12

In 2021-22, new students came from:

- · Dauphin, Lancaster, or Lebanon counties-22%
- Other Pennsylvania counties—48%
- States other than Pennsylvania—30%

The male-to-female ratio is approximately 1:1, and over 50% of MHS students have a sibling in attendance.

### **Divisions**

MHS consists of three divisions, each emphasizing the specific needs and interests of the ages it serves.

Elementary Division: Pre-K-Grade 4 Middle Division: Grade 5-Grade 8 Senior Division: Grade 9-Grade 12

### **Faculty**

There are over 300 caring and talented full- and part-time teachers committed to whole child education.

### **Home Life**

MHS has over 180 student homes, each with eight to 12 students. led by more than 600 full- and part-time houseparents.

Seniors live together in 10 Transitional Living apartment-style buildings meant to prepare them for independent living after graduation. There are approximately 35 Transitional Living staff members.

### **Career and Technical Certifications**

Every MHS student graduates with two or more industry-recognized certifications, choosing among 12 career paths.

# **Technology**

From high-tech "smart" classrooms to laptops for Senior Division students to computers in the student homes, MHS is committed to providing the tools and the technological education each student needs to learn and prepare for the future.

### **Activities**

From sports to arts to leadership development, MHS offers experiences that help young people pursue their passions and grow as individuals. Everything they need to participate is provided by the school.

### **After MHS**

Whatever they do after graduation, MHS students lead successful lives. MHS college and career counselors begin working with students in grade 8 and continue their support for six years after graduation.

MHS students can accrue up to \$95,000 in continuing education scholarship support through strong academic and behavioral performance and good citizenship.

# **Minimum Qualifications for Admission**

To be considered for enrollment, a child must meet the following five criteria:

- Come from a low-income family
- · Be 4-15 years old at the time of enrollment
- Have the ability to learn at MHS
- Be free from serious behavioral problems likely to disrupt the classroom or student home life at MHS
- Overall, have the ability to participate in and benefit from the MHS program

# Is my child a good fit for MHS?
